These days places like Microsoft, YouTube, Zoom, and all places of technology drive me beyond crazy with changing how their programs work and moving things around. Often these days just about the time I learn where things are in programs like Word, Excel, Outlook, and other programs I use and depend on every day, some whippersnapper wants to shake things up and I have to spend inordinate and unacceptable amounts of time relearning programs I already knew. My genealogy program that I loved and was simple and easy to use disappeared completely and the new one I had to buy and use went from version 7 (it took me a long time to figure it out) to version 8 which is universally acknowledged as a mistake, to now version 9 which I just don't want to learn. Change is not always good.

We do pay for the lot to be cleared, but to add the cost of a person(s) to clear the sidewalks is prohibitive.

If you can volunteer to join our snow teams for the coming winter please let Dr. Chance or me know as soon as possible, but no later than two weeks from now. This way we can put our teams together and provide a schedule for the Snow Team members.
