CONSISTENTLY

Contradictions are when one thing about something contradicts or stands in contrast to something else about the same thing. I am full of contradictions and inconsistencies. I'm consistently inconsistent.

Too often I take inconsistent stands on things or beliefs. I'm against sin in general but when I sin in particular somehow I

look beyond my own sin. I'm fully aware of the importance of eating healthy but one my favorite sayings is "If you can't fry it why are you eating it?"

I think we're all guilty of being overflowing baskets of contradictions and inconsistencies. We say one thing and do another. We take stands on one thing but then an opposite stand on another thing which is substantively the same thing. We apply one set of standards or requirements for someone we like but then an entirely different set of standards or requirements for someone we aren't so fond of. One moment we can be princes of peace and in another moment "war lords" full of anger and attack. One day we can be gentle and kind, on another harsh and unforgiving. You get the picture, if we're honest with ourselves we can be both/and, yes/no, up/down, left/right and on and on. It's just part of human nature I suppose.

So, what do we do about it? We begin by recognizing our own inconsistencies and on alert for when we are reflecting inconsistent or contradictory behaviors. To go a bit further I think beyond recognizing our inconsistent and contradictory nature it's important to own it. Yes, sometimes I take opposite positions on the same issue. Beyond all this I think we have to hold ourselves to being as consistent and not contradictory as we can be.

The benefits of recognizing and dealing with our inconsistent nature is to not only hold ourselves accountable (seeing the beam in our own eye rather than the splinter in our neighbor's eye) to a higher standard of consistency but being more patient when we see others being inconsistent. One time in the middle of a strongly emotional discussion with a good friend I accused my friend of being "inconsistent". My friend paused, looked me in the eyes and said "True, I'll allow you your inconsistencies if you will allow me mine". He was so right. I repented of my attitude of judgement immediately and recognized we were both being inconsistent.

One of my favorite characters in the Bible is Paul. I like Paul for many reasons but one of the most important things I like and admire about him is that he is plainly and consistently "inconsistent". He sometimes contradicts himself in mid stride. I like that about Paul. He was human. We're all human. We all take inconsistent stands, express contradictory opinions, and go on about our business. So, let's recognize our inconsistencies and contradictions and go on with trying to do better.

Each year about this time we put together "Snow Teams" to clear the snow from our sidewalks during the winter months. Montgomery County treats us like a business which means we have 24 hours from the time the snow (2" and above) stops falling to clear it from the sidewalks in front of the church or pay a large fine. Of course, we need our own sidewalk inside the driveway shoveled too.

Due to people moving out of the area, we are down to a very small number of volunteers. In the past we had two people per team with each team serving for a two-week period between the end of November and March. Last winter we only had one person per team, which isn't enough. We need more than one. We have a good big snow blower, salt on hand and hopefully a snowplow on our mower ready for use. We do pay for the lot to be cleared, but to add the cost of a person(s) to clear the sidewalks is prohibitive.

If you can volunteer to join our snow teams for the coming winter please let Dr. Chance or me know as soon as possible, but no later than two weeks from now. This way we can put our teams together and provide a schedule for the Snow Team members.
