A Manatee Rescue

While in the Citrus Springs Florida area Mary and I had the opportunity to see hundreds of Manatees. I have a new appreciation for Manatees. They are amazing animals. Manatees are large, gray aquatic mammals with bodies that taper to a flat, paddle-shaped tail. They have two forelimbs, called flippers.

Their head and face are wrinkled with whiskers on the snout. Their closest living relatives are the elephant and the hyrax. The average adult manatee is about 10 feet long and weighs between 800 and 1,200 pounds. During the winter they gather in the rivers and springs of warm waters. Due to the unusual cold weather in Florida, scrapes with boat propellers or other issues they can become sick and in need of rescue.

One day Mary and I went to Three Sisters Springs and just happened upon a Manatee Rescue. It was absolutely amazing to see how a Manatee Rescue unfolds. The goal was to rescue a Manatee in danger or poor health and send it to a place where it can be healed and brought back to good health and then rereleased back into the wild. We were so lucky to see Rescue unfold. There were 50 or 60 Manatees in the Three Sisters Springs. Somehow the rescuers had to coax the one who was sick into a smaller and smaller area where a strong rescue tarp could be put under it and then the Manatee lifted to a large tank of water and then driven to the Manatee Hospital.

What amazed us was the number of people involved, the degree of cooperation required among twenty or so people and the time and patience required. Basically, the group of people rescuing the Manatee had a large net and they had to work in harmony with one another to coax the injured Manatee into the area where the net was suspended in the water. Then, little by little without startling the Manatee the confined area got smaller and smaller to where eventually the Manatee was in a space just big enough to slide the rescue tarp under it. Then six or eight people lifted the tarp with the 1000 pound Manatee in it and took it the waiting tank of water. Then they loaded the Manatee and tank into a truck to be taken to the rescue hospital. In addition, another person or two had to keep scooping fresh warm spring water on the back of the Manatee.

What really impressed me was how everyone knew their job. Each person or group of people had a specific role to play. They were all volunteers, yet, they all had to work in unison and with full cooperation. There were no single actors. With all of that, however, there was one person who was clearly in charge. One person called out the orders, telling everyone exactly when to move and what to do next. There wasn't room for debate or discussion of "alternative ideas. Clear leadership was critical to mission success.

Perhaps that's a great model for the church to follow. Many people committed to a shared vision, many people sharing in helping to make that vision happen. Vision, mission, clear leadership and direction from a leader or leaders. Not a sermon, just a thought!
