Game Cameras are designed for hunters or hikers to strap to a tree in the woods and record snapshots of any kind of animal or person that enters the field of view. The game camera will pick up people, deer, turkey, dogs, any kind of object that moves into the view. The images of the snapshots are stored on a flash drive. When I picked the camera up water came pouring out and I knew the camera was destroyed. I took the camera back to my office and pulled the card out. The camera was indeed hopelessly broken but the card still showed some images on it. The last image recorded was the full-face image of a deer who was very curious. It was probably the deer that knocked the camera down from the tree. Oh well, I shouldn't have let so much time pass between checking the camera anyway. My bad. I had a great picture of the deer's eyes, mouth and snout face on, however.

Life is a lot like the story of my game camera. When we forget to check on our relationships with each other and with the Lord bad things are going to happen. 

Year to Date Average: Total: 51 (35 in person /17 online)


