Now, as I hobble along I am paying the rent on those golden "Turkey Bowls."

Another favorite Thanksgiving memory of mine was gathering around the table with my mother and faither, brother and sisters and usually a friend or two of our family and having a wonderful meal. One year a friend of my dad's and my first "employer" bellowed "what do I have to do to get enough water during this meal." My dad, a man of few words got up, opened the window to the dining room, went outside and passed a water hose through the window and asked Charlie if that would do the trick. We all laughed; except my mother who didn't think it was so funny. We always ate on mom's finest China. Thanksgiving is full of memories for all of my life. Each new year brings new special memories. Times with our children and grandchildren will always be in our hearts. What unites all the varied memories is the people who shared the day with us and made it special. Thanksgiving at its best isn't about what's on the table but rather who is around the table with us.

- 6 cups cranberry juice or pomegranate cranberry juice\*
- 3 cups pineapple juice\*\*
- 1 Tbsp almond extract
- 3 liters ginger ale
- 1 (12 oz.) bag fresh cranberries (optional)
- 2 fresh limes, sliced (optional)
- Ice

#### **Instructions**

- 1. Pour cranberry juice, pineapple juice, and almond extract into a large drink dispenser and mix.
- 2. Pour in ginger ale and give it one quick stir.
- 3. Add in cranberries, ice and ginger ale. Serve within a few hours for the best results as it will start to go flat.






# December 1st
