I recently came across an excellent book entitled "Getting Through What You'll Never Get Over." It's a provocative title and reading it has helped me a lot through some hard times of my own.

While checking in recently at a doctor's office I overheard the receptionist describing the sudden and unexpected loss of her son. Without being intrusive or pushy I asked her if I could be of any help

and that I would lift her up in my prayers. She was appreciative of my conversation with her although I kept it short and low key. Once I got home I decided to buy another copy of the book I had found so helpful and I dropped it off to her the next time I went to the office.

Hard times come in lots of ways. Life can turn sudden and hard on us at any given moment. It often turns difficult just when we expect it the least. We can never really "prepare" for hard times except by having a faith in the Lord's presence and calling on his strength when our own isn't sufficient. The loss of a loved one is one of life's hardest times to get through. We'll never get over it, but we can find ways to get through it. The loss of our job can be a difficult jolt with lots of costs to us that go far beyond the economic losses. Self-esteem, familiar routines, the loss of connections at work can all take a toll. The betrayal of a friend, especially one we felt especially fond of can be devasting. Hard times come in lots of ways. In fact, the book of Job is centered around one man's loss in every way imaginable.

Pat answers never bring much help either. Faith can come hard. Old answers can seem trite or just don't work any longer for us. Words of support that are meant to be kind can sting and rub our wounds even deeper. Familiar passages of scriptures can lose their meaning or suddenly cause us to think in different ways.

There are ways to get through what we'll never over, however. Keeping faith in the Lord has always been a help to me even in my hardest moments. Searching the scriptures with a new heart and new openness can bring new insights that we never had before. Coming to church and being with other people of faith can help us rediscover the power of community. We give strength to one another and when we are weak others can share their strength with us and when others are weak we can share our strength with them. Accepting that nothing stays the same and facing the inevitable losses of life and the ups and downs as part of life can help us as well. There are lots of other ways we can get through what we'll never get over. What are the ways that have helped you through your hard times and deepest losses in life?

May God give you the strength and the faith to get through your hard times.

It's a wonderful time to invite friends to join you or even come with you to church.




